

PENGUINPIG is the third show from TRAUM, who were founded in 2014 by Artistic Director Jane Crawshaw ("Actor-Puppeteer Jane Crawshaw is excellent" — The Guardian for The Paper Dolls at Little Angel Theatre). TRAUM are based in Lincolnshire, and create unique, imaginative and inventive theatre for everyone aged 1 to 100. Combining our trademark style of physical performance, puppetry and original music, we specialise in taking top quality theatre to rural communities, and telling untold Lincolnshire stories to a wider audience across the UK and beyond.





TRAUM'S previous shows include Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes, a performance installation for 8-12 year olds, in partnership with Culture Works East, Ideastap and Latitude Festival; where children had the chance to make their very own shadow puppetry play, and Christmas Storms and Sunshine, a Christmas show for families based on the short story by Elizabeth Gaskell. The show incorporated live music, singing, original songs, puppetry and clowning, performed by an all-female cast.


BENEFITS FOR SCHOOLS

Penguinpig has been created in line with the National Curriculum's aim for safer Internet practice for KSI, which is that children "are responsible, competent, confident and creative users of information and communication technology". Penguinpig's central message is based on the main KSI Attainment Target, which is that children should "use technology safely and respectfully, keeping personal information private; identify where to go for help and support when they have concerns about content or contact on the internet or other online technologies."

PENGUINPIG is an interactive show, which approaches e-safety in an exciting and accessible way for children, using beautiful



puppetry, catchy songs and a fun and childcentered narrative story. The e-safety theme of the show is explored further through our interactive and age-appropriate follow-up workshops (suitable for both EYFS and KS1). Our production also comes with a teacher's resource pack, so your school can continue the conversation on safer Internet practice throughout the term. Our aim is to help your pupils make more progress in their e-safety skills and become more confident online. Our show will also enrich your pupils creatively and imaginatively, and if you're an arts award school our production can go towards helping your pupils achieve their Discover Arts Award.
